TURNTABLE DRAWINGS is an ongoing collaboration between composer Danny Clay and printmaker Jon Fischer based on a growing series of hand-molded, playable records. Since 2016, the project has been presented in conjunction with over twenty guest artists in numbered works that span interdisciplinary forms including immersive installations, scored musical compositions, visual art exhibitions, and interactive workshops. Using loops as the raw material for collaboration and creation, the project explores the connections between physical imprints, sound, music, and beauty.

For this one-day program at the de Young Museum, Danny & Jon present four new Turntable Drawings that unfold in four separate spaces around the museum. Based on the "de Young seven inches," a record batch derived from six new recordings (O page for the catalog), these sonic interventions are continuously active in their respective galleries throughout the afternoon--you'll see them interface with our roving brass and wind ensemble in performance cycles. (Check the schedule ## for details.) We invite you to discover these live installations for yourself, drop some needles*, and enjoy the magic of records.

Free Saturdays are about celebrating art and this city that we love. Every Saturday, San Francisco residents enjoy free general admission to the city's museum, the de Young and Legion of Honor. All are welcome to join in our free programs.




